from San Joaquin County Probation*

I am a Probation Unit Supervisor. I have been with the Probation Department for 19 years. I have spent a lot of my career in Adult Domestic Violence. I was supervisor of our Backgrounds & Training Division for five years. For the last four years, I have been starting the program I oversee now called the Community Accountability and Prevention Services Program (CAPS). This is a prevention program for high-risk youth that have not yet had contact with law enforcement and we would like to keep it that way. Under this umbrella of CAPS, I have three separate programs. One is Crossroads, which use to be a grant funded program that ended about 10 years ago, and has now been brought back as part of the general budget. I have four social workers that counsel high risk youth between the ages of 10-18. It is short term, about 6-10 sessions,

in which time they try to get to the root of the problem, mentor the youth, and refer out to other community agencies if necessary. These youths come to us from referrals by the school, other agencies, and the parents can self-refer.

Next I have Community Accountability Boards (CABS), which are on five different school campuses in the county. This program targets youth kindergarten through eighth grade. This is a panel of 4-6 volunteers that meet once a month as a group at the school and mentor one to two youth that are assigned to them. They meet with them weekly for 30-90 days to see if they can make a difference in their behavior. These youths are recommended by the school facilitator and the parent and child must be willing to participate in the program, in lieu of suspension.

The third program I have is Discovery Challenge Academy (DCA), which is a partnership between County Office of Education, National Guard, and Probation. It is a five-month residential program specifically targeted for high risk youth that are short on credits. This is for youth 16-18 years old and they must want to attend.

I will be speaking on the type of high risk youth that we deal with and what works and what doesn't. Hope this is what you wanted. It is probably more than you wanted, but feel free to cut out whatever you feel you don't need.
